"Utopia" Several series from 2022 - 2021 Artist's Statement, "Utopia", June 2022

In 2017, I pivoted from semi-abstract figurative expressionism to modern geometric abstraction. It was a turning point in my career.

The shift can be attributed to my experiences at two of the world's most extraordinary sights: Bryce Canyon National Park in Utah, and Faraya in Lebanon.

I marveled at Bryce Canyon's huge and immersive amphitheater, home to the greatest concentration of "hoodoos" on earth.

Likewise, while off-roading in Faraya with Mr. Johnny Mokbel, I found myself struck with awe and inspiration over the millenary limestone rock formations, carved by wind and water over the centuries. I stood astonished by a chain of six hills 1900 meters above the sea.

The Rock & Landscape series came to life on very large canvasses between 2019 and 2021. Large paintings, to me, are grandiose. You are in it. I characterize my paintings by minimalist or complex hard-edged compositions of shapes and colors. My 50 years of chromatic experience was stimulated to interact in primary, secondary and tertiary chromatic palettes, which made the journey more enjoyable. Each tone reveals a particular weight, density, and transparency.

My new collection consists of several series: Rock, Rock Variations, Kissing Rocks, Skyhill, Earth Rise, Blue Diamond, Palm Tree and Olive Tree.

Earthrise Series: A cosmic series of 6 oil paintings





A derivative of the imaginary vision of the Rock Series that depicts the vertically rectilinear rock formations and the mountain-top hills of Faraya. From valleys to floating hills, from primary colors to secondary and tertiary, the exploration of colors becomes subtle, yet powerful. Then it pushes further up towards the cosmic boundaries with the creation of the Earthrise Series.


The mountain is thought to contain divine inspiration and it is the focus of pilgrimages of transcendence and spiritual elevation. It is a universal symbol of the nearness of God, as it surpasses ordinary humanity and extends towards the sky and the heavens.

Skyhill represents compassion, creativity, reliability, generosity, loyalty, and a love for domestic life.









Nutritionally, it has proven health benefits.


Agriculturally, it gives olives in abundance without asking anything in return. Not even water.

From left to right, the branches and the leaves are quite realistic.


In the middle the tree is formed in an abstract way, and on the far right hand side it becomes completely abstract.

## Missak Terzian's Biography

Lebanese-American, b.1949 in Beirut to Armenian Genocide survivors. Missak Terzian studied at Ecole d'Art Guvder in 1968 and graduated from London College of Printing in 1971. He held his first major art exhibition in 1984. Since then, the artist has participated in 143 exhibitions worldwide.

Missak Terzian has explored and perfected many different types of techniques and styles. Since his early years circa 60's he is constantly evolving and pushing the boundaries. Missak's colors are recognized for being strong yet subtle, vivacious yet elegant.

In 2019 he pivoted from semi-abstract figurative expressionism to modern geometric abstraction.

His paintings are part of many collections in Europe, United States, the Middle East, Lebanon, Saudi Arabia, Armenia, the United Arab Emirates, Canada and the Republic of China; namely the Saudi Royal family and prominent Lebanese political personalities. His works are on permanent display at the Institut du Monde Arabe, Paris, France and throughout Lebanon, at the Dalloul Art Foundation DAF, the bank Audi head office, the Armenian Catholicossate of Cilicia museum, Haigazian university, the Sursock museum, the museum of Bzommar, the Banque du Liban head office, the Bank of Sharjah head office and Dubai collection.

With an innate and primal impulse to create, Missak Terzian is in timeless search for existentialism and is eager to record time and occurrences. "For me, painting is a visual testament of the mind, body and spirit. Distortion, exaggeration or minimalist triggers in me a continuous search for the unknown, Missak Explains.
